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# THE HUB MEETS FAMILY GOALS

As parents raising four children, Kris and Alan Young are always looking for opportunities to promote lifelong learning and expose their children to STEAM activities. In our MakerSpace, The Hub, they have found a great resource for both.

The Young family has participated in ongoing educational Hub programs, learning to use the 3D printer, sewing machines, laser and vinyl cutters, take home MakerKits, etc. They also have taken advantage of customized instruction from Hub staff based on their own project goals. Kris was able to facilitate her daughter's Girl Scout Troop activity in The Hub; the girls learned to sew using sewing machines. Young's teenagers have taken the tinker exploration approach; designing and sending fun creations from home to make on the 3D printer.

The Youngs started bringing their children to the library when they were infants and are frequent library users. They find offerings like The Hub and the ability to checkout telescopes, Wifi hotspots, board games, etc. from our Library of THINGS adds to their library experience. Kris commented, "We value tactile and hands-on STEAM experiences. The Hub provides opportunities to explore, create and build for our whole family!"

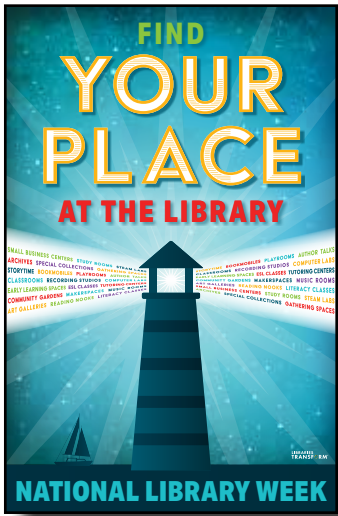

## 2020 Census | 10 Questions - 10 Minutes - 10 Years of Impact

The census is an inventory of every person who lives in the United States and takes place every 10 years. An accurate count is important because it impacts our daily lives and is used to fairly divide:

- **POLITICAL POWER** (congressional seats, Electoral College votes),
- **FUNDING** (for public programs from roads to school lunches, emergency assistance, Medicaid, and student loans)
- **DECISION MAKING** in the public and private sectors (all demographic reports are based on Census data).

For the first time, households will be able to respond online; mail and telephone responses will also be available. Be on the lookout for your mailed reminder card which has a unique code for your address that you will need to fill out the Census. The questionnaire takes 10 minutes to complete and we will have dedicated computers available for you to use. Get counted and help our community thrive!

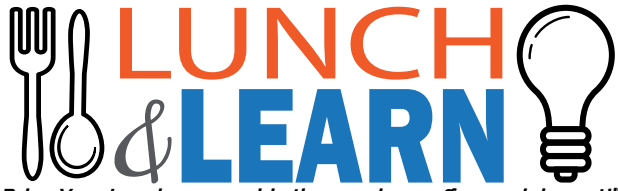
